With much excitement we put on our best clothes and arrived at Buckingham Palace at 2.45pm. While the bands continued to play a selection of music, The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh circulated among the guests. 5,000 guests were provided with a wonderful afternoon tea and were free to stroll around the beautiful Palace gardens.

At each Garden Party, around 27,000 cups of tea, 20,000 sandwiches and 20,000 slices of cake are consumed! Lesley said that they really did need to 'pinch ourselves' every so often, as it all seemed so unreal.



Maths Challenges Across the School

This term has seen lots of St Anthony's pupils participating in the weekly maths challenges. These have included some seriously difficult dot-to-dots of more than 500 numbers. The apparently simple process of counting should not be under-estimated. It gives pupils a deeper understanding of the relationships of numbers and helps especially with their perception of crossing tens and hundreds boundaries. The finished pictures have often been coloured beautifully. Some of the stars in this have been Connor W, Kailum B, Crystal K, Nikita L and Connor C.



Maths Qualifications

In mathematics we offer all KS 4 students the chance to try and achieve an 'early entry' qualification. This consists of an exam that has to be passed, and two pieces of coursework. There are three different levels of difficulty, with level 1 being the easiest and level 3 the hardest.

All our year 11 students have completed the coursework and passed one of the examinations- a lot of students achieved a level 3 grade. Due to this year's success, from September we are planning to offer the 'early entry' course in year 10 so that they can try to attain a pass at 'Functional Skills Mathematics Level 1' which involves solving real life problems and is actually equivalent to a grade 'F' in GCSE Mathematics.

Road Safety

In order to keep our children safe as they gain their independence by walking and crossing roads to and from school, we would like to remind all parents, carers and grandparents to not park on the yellow zig zag lines or park in the taxi/bus lanes at the start or end of the school day.

Equally important we also ask you not to park at the entrances of the road. By parking here, pedestrians and other drivers' views are impaired which does not allow for a safe exit in or out of school. I have had some of the neighbours speak with me this term about parking around the school and issues that they face living beside a school, so please keep this in mind when parking. Parking across driveways and leaving engines running can cause inconvenience to our neighbours.
